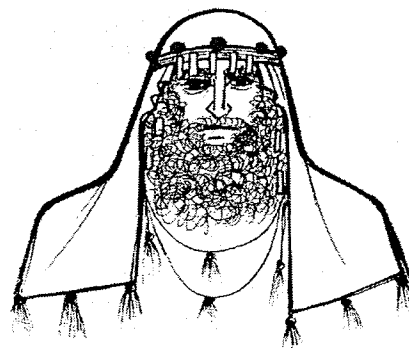

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

There are two items I am going to mention in this space today. First, this is the Sunday on which we change our clocks, setting them back one hour. The fact is that time zones are very arbitrary. For most of history the vast majority of people cared far more about where the sun was in the sky than what time a clock might indicate. A major reason for the adoption of time zones in the United States was the rise of railroads and the need for standard times for arrivals and departures. All this is an introduction to the reality that clocks and other timepieces are tools created by people to meet some need. Unfortunately it often happens that we end up being servants of our tools rather than them serving us. I am certainly guilty of this in relation to time. Maybe this is an opportunity to reflect on whether our tools, whether low or high tech, free us or enslave us.

Second, Saturday, November 11, is Veterans Day. A huge thanks to all veterans.

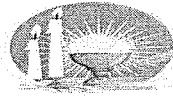
