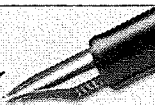
Mission Statement

From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

There are two items I am going to mention in this space today. First, I remind you that in our diocese as in most dioceses of the United States, the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord has been transferred to Sunday. Therefore, we will observe the Ascension next Sunday, May 28. Let me take this opportunity to note that the time period of 40 days between the Resurrection and the Ascension signifies "long enough". There are numerous examples of the use of "40" in the Bible and this number should not necessarily be understood as a matter of arithmetic. It is more similar to my dad saying, "I've told you that 1,000 times." Second, Our diocese is blessed with a large number of seminarians. Currently we have 20 men in various stages of seminary formation. For a diocese of our size, this is outstanding. When I discuss this with other priests from dioceses much larger than ours they can hardly believe these numbers. In addition to these numbers I can personally testify to the high quality of these men. With every blessing comes a responsibility. Part of our response to the blessing of so many seminarians is supporting them financially. All of these men have several years of education/formation after college. Many of them are in school for an additional 6 years. Every year at the beginning of June our diocese conducts a special collection to help with the cost of this preparation. These are men who will soon be serving us as parish priests. I hope we will generously support them. There are envelopes in your packets and also in church for this collection, please use them. Our goal is \$9,089

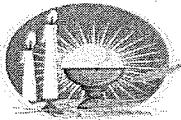

The Crux Camp offers outdoor adventure including archery, high-rope activities, and canoe expeditions, in combination with amazing spiritual opportunities such as Mass, Confession, and Eucharist Adoration. ready the church for Ordinary Time.

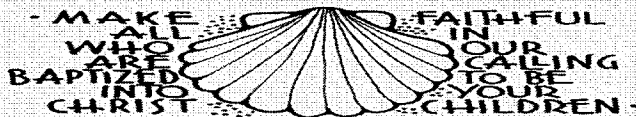

"JOURNEY AROUND THE WORLD AND DEEP INTO
FAITH", is from the Catholicism
Series by Aux. Bishop Robert Barron.
Episode 9: The Life of His Love:
Prayer and the Life of the Spirit

In this lesson, Bishop Barron explores Catholic spirituali-
ty, which is centered on prayer. As the Catechism of the
Catholic Church states: "Prayer is the lifting up of the
mind and the heart to God." On pilgrimage to the places
where the great saints and spiritual masters lived, Bishop
Barron explores the different types of prayer: contempla-
tion; adoration; petition; and intercession. In telling the
stories of Catholics like Thomas Merton, St. Theresa of
Avila and St. John of the Cross, Bishop Barron demon-
strates how the human person can be transformed through
prayer that manifests a deep, spiritual commitment cen-
tered in Christ.
