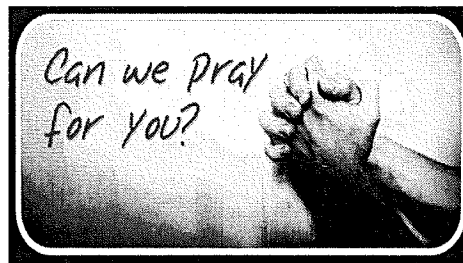

Snack will be provided.

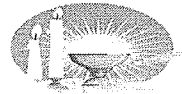
